# **Adjunct Instructor**

I currently teach at A&M-San Antonio as an adjunct History instructor. I teach one class per semester face-to-face. I create assignments, quizzes, group work, and tests. I encourage as much online interaction as possible to create a sense of community with my students. I use Blackboard and Excel to keep track of grades for my courses. I teach US History I and II at A&M-SA.

I piloted, in fall 2023, an academic recovery course targeted at students who were academically dismissed from the University. Instead of students completing academic appeals to return to the University, we are giving students the option to stay enrolled in their classes, but also enroll in the Academic Recovery course, UNIV 1000. 18 students signed up for the course in fall 2023 and 25 students are enrolled in the course for spring 2024.

I currently work at A&M-San Antonio as the Executive Director of the Student Academic Success Center. I supervise 6 success coaches, retention specialists, the Testing Center, Foster Support Services, theDream.US scholar program, and the Tutoring Center. I supervise 14 staff members and have over 40 peer staff including tutors, SI leaders, and peer mentors/coaches. I participated in the creation of a first year experience course that lasts four semesters, downward expansion, a week of welcome program, and a BANNER implementation project. I have worked on a developmental education plan for A&M-San Antonio and TSI policies. I hired the Assistant Director of Tutoring, the Director of Student Success and Testing, and 6 success coaches. I implemented an early alert system in EAB-Navigate as well as in Civitas-Inspire. I also implemented EAB-Navigate and a suite of Civitas products for the Student Success Center and Academic Advising. I created all training materials for my staff in regards to TSI, EAB-SSC, Blackboard, and BANNER.

In 2016, A&M-San Antonio became a partner college with theDream.US. I started as the scholar advisor for the campus with 2 scholars in fall 2016. As of spring 2022, A&M-SA has 109 scholars in the program. To assist with recruitment of this program, I have hosted a DREAM Summit for 9-12 graders who are Dreamers from school districts that surround A&M-SA. In 2022, we have supported over 250 high school Dreamers on our campus through the Summit. In 2018, A&M-SA partnered with the Bexar County Fostering Educational Success (BCFES) pilot project to assist foster youth in enrolling and graduating from a college or University in San Antonio. I manage two grants: BCFES grant for foster youth and the Blue Meridian grant for Dreamers. The BCFES grant is over \$340,000 split into two years (this grant is funded through summer 2024). The Blue Meridian grant is \$120,000 split over two years (this grant is funded through December 2022).

#### **Academic Advisor I-IV**

I worked at the University of Texas- San Antonio as an academic advisor. My main duties were to advise freshmen through seniors. I worked with students on choosing courses, navigating the university system, and guiding them through to graduation. I also work hand-in-hand with the departments within the College. To go along with my liaison, I worked with my director and the departments to research and approve articulation agreements with 14 community colleges within Texas. I created an online probation program as well as an online training program for new advisors. I also supervised 7-13 advisors and 3 front desk staff members. I transitioned from College of Sciences Advising to Life and Health Science Advising. I chaired the training subcommittee during a time when UTSA was going to transition to a new advising system. I worked on creating training materials for DegreeWorks for College of Sciences Advising as well as Life and Health Sciences Advising. I kept track of caseloads in BANNER for Life and Health Sciences Advising. I helped train staff on Global (Microsoft CRM) and was a super user of the system.

## **Grants/Awards**

**Blue Meridian Grant, 2021**- The Student Academic Success Center was awarded a sub-grant with the Up Partnership through Blue Meridian. This grant is supporting the enrollment and retention of Dreamers at A&M-San Antonio. The Student Academic Success Center was awarded \$120,000 split into 1 year increments of \$60,000. The grant is funded through December 2022.

**BCFES Grant, 2019**-A&M-SA is a partner in the Bexar County Fostering Educational Success pilot project. This project's goal is to enroll and graduate foster youth in San Antonio. A&M-SA is awarded \$340,000 split into 2 year increments of \$170,000. The funding was approved again through the Texas Legislature for 2022-2024.

**NACADA Program Award, 2011**-The online probation program entitled "Strategies for Academic Success (SAS)" was honored at the annual NACADA Conference in October 2011.

**Star Award-December 2010-** Awarded to a staff member in the College of Sciences who provides excellent service to its students and the state of Texas.

**Rising Star Award, 2008**-This award is given to a new UTSA staff member who has made significant contributions throughout the year to his or her area, or to the University community. This individual has innovative ideas and has made significant contributions.
