Course Description: This course provides teacher candidates with a method of teaching and assessing social studies in the early childhood through elementary grade levels; including methods of selecting and organizing social studies programs, the sequence of the content of the social studies curriculum, adapting and enriching social studies programs to meet the needs of all students, and creating assessments aligned with the social studies curriculum.

 - i. Teachers teach both the key content knowledge and the key skills of the discipline.
 - ii. Teachers make appropriate and authentic connections across disciplines, subjects, and students' real-world experiences.
