- The influence of parenting styles, instructional practices, and educational programs
- Appropriate tools for the formative and summative assessment of young children
- The implementation of integrated curriculum using a variety of approaches
- Addressing all of the academic content areas: math, reading, social studies, and science
- Culturally relevant instruction
- The impact of technology on the early childhood classroom
