HONR 4000: Honors Capstone

Course Overview:

The Honors Capstone course is taken in conjunction with a corresponding capstone course in an Honors student's academic major. The student must submit an application to the Honors Program in advance that includes a research project proposal demonstrating the application of their learning to an in-depth project. In order to receive Honors credit, the final project must include a scholarly product appropriate for the student's major, periodic reflective writing, and a public presentation of the student's work.

This course may be repeated one additional semester if the capstone project takes place across two semesters, with program approval.

Prerequisites:

Junior or senior standing; Honors program approval.

Course Catalog Description:

This Honors Capstone is a seminar-style course taken in conjunction with the corresponding capstone course in an Honors student's academic major. Students complete a major research project in their major, engage in periodic reflective writing, and present their work in a professional setting. (0-0-0)

Course Objectives:

- 1. Demonstrate advanced skills in research, planning, writing, and presentation.
- 2. Produce a high-caliber research project.

Reading Materials and Topics will rotate with the student's major requirements.
