Catalog Course Description: This course introduces the nature and structure of the US and Texas legal systems; the basic principles of legal reasoning; and laws having a substantial impact on business including contracts, business organizations, and the Uniform Commercial Code.

Student Learning Outcomes: Upon completion of this course, you should be able to:

- Understand Business Entities including the advantages and disadvantages of each.
- Identify the difference between Intentional Torts and Negligence.
- Analyze if a valid, enforceable Contract exists.
- Evaluate case problems using Legal Reasoning.

Grading Policy:

Term Papers: There will be 4 terms papers that will require you to discuss legal entities such as corporations, LLC, non-profits and general partnerships. Each paper will be worth 100 points and must be conducted in APA format. Instructions for the paper are provided in the assignment details. Papers will be due Sundays by midnight.

Discussion Boards: There are 4 discussion topics assigned on Blackboard that are available on Monday and end on Sunday by midnight. You must respond "at a minimum" to two others in class on two separate days. Your responses must be substantial contributions to the assignment, supported by sources (statutes, cases, articles). Use the university online library system to locate scholarly sources.

McGrawhill Connect Assignments: Every week there are McGrawhill Connect assignments. These assignments will grade based on how much you read, completed eLearning assignments and completion of mini-quizzed. Connect assignments will be due Sundays by midnight
