EDBA 3304 Ethical and Professional Behavior in ABA

A. MAJOR COURSE DESCRIPTION/REQUIREMENT

This course teaches students about ethics in ABA. Students are introduced to the Professional and Ethical Compliance Code for Behavior Analysts published by the Behavior Analysis Certification Board. A large focus is placed on behaving professionally and ethically when providing ABA service in various settings. Personnel supervision and management is discussed. Real-life examples are used to illustrate ethical issues.

Upon Completion of the course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Define ethics in ABA.
- 2. Identify how to maintain professional behavior when providing ABA services.
- 3. Identify ethical issues that may arise in various situations.
- 4. State resources for maintaining ethical and professional behavior.
