A. MAJOR COURSE DESCRIPTION/REQUIREMENT

This course teaches students to utilize ABA strategies to provide effective training to parents, caregivers, and staff. The course focuses on supervision and management skills used at an individual level, including staff and caregivers. Students learn to set expectations, assess skills, and monitor performance.

- 1. State why ABA strategies should be used when training others.
- 2. Describe how to assess skills of staff and caregivers.
- 3. Describe how to set expectations for staff and caregivers.
- 4. Utilize behavior skills training to train others.
- 5. Describe how to monitor the performance of staff and caregivers.
