EDAD 5383: Public School Law

A. MAJOR COURSE DESCRIPTION/REQUIREMENT

This course will discuss federal and state legal regulations as they relate to public school administration. Students will explore the application of significant court decisions as they relate to school leadership. Particular emphasis is placed on the rights and responsibilities of students, teachers, and school leaders. (Domain 4. Executive Leadership: Communication and Organizational Leadership).
